Remember to take good notes (see Good Work Chart)		 Write only the most important words, not complete sentences. Try to put in your own words (but using some exact words is okay if we understand them). Do not write unneeded words like: and, to, the, of, or, are, they, etc Take notes on one subtopic at a time (for example, "what they eat". Put a heading on your notes (like - "What they eat"). This helps you keep your notes organized
