





















<p>Weathering</p> <p>The physical or chemical process that breaks down rock.</p> 	<p>Erosion</p> <p>The process of moving sediment from one place to another.</p>  <p>The river cuts down and deepens its valley. The river widens its valley as it deepens it. The river continues to widen its valley.</p>
<p>Deposition</p> <p>The dropping, depositing or settling of eroded materials or sediments.</p> 	<p>Sediment</p> <p>Bits of rock, soil, and other materials that have been weathered, eroded, and deposited.</p>  <p>June 19, 2002 November 9, 2010</p>
<p>Transpiration</p> <p>The process in which plants give off water vapor through tiny openings called stomata.</p> 	<p>Latitude</p> <p>The measurement of distance north or south on the globe. The lines of latitude go around the Earth, like rungs of a ladder.</p>  <p>Latitude Longitude</p>
<p>Full Moon</p> <p>The Earth, Sun, and Moon are aligned, with the Moon on the opposite side of the Earth; the Moon looks fully lit.</p>	<p>High Pressure Area</p> <p>An area that has a higher concentration of air. A high pressure system usually means good weather because it attracts cool and dry air.</p>  <p>STURMBOOM WEATHER PATTERN WARM COLD</p>
<p>Accumulation</p> <p>A gathering or increase of something, like snow, over time.</p>  	<p>Unbalanced Force</p> <p>Forces that cause a change in an object's motion because the opposing forces don't cancel each other out. Examples: lifting a box, accelerating a car; dropping a ball.</p>  <p>Gravity Lift</p>

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
